



Dend. moniliforme

Dend. moniliforme – exhibited by George Birss

Found from China through Korea, Vietnam to Himalayas and Nepal where it grows at elevations of 800 to 3000 metres it is a medium sized cool to warm growing epiphyte.

As the plant matures the erect canes may become pendulous. The canes will drop their leaves, they are a deciduous orchid and prefer to flower on leafless canes.

The flowers are a pristine white with a purple or brown throat, some have a greenish throat.

This orchid likes plenty of water and fertilizer in spring and summer in its growing period and for a better flowering the next year reduce the water and fertilizer in the cooler Winter months.

Give moderate to bright light and good air circulation.



Osmo. pulchellum

Osmoglossum pulchellum – *exhibited by Mark Drury*

This stunning species is endemic to Mexico through Central America as a cool growing epiphyte at elevations of 1200 to 2600 metres.

With clustered ovate pseudobulbs that carry 2 to 3 erect leaves. The erect inflorescence, that may need staking to support the flowers, arise from mature pseudobulbs.

The inflorescence holds from 4 to 10 long lasting fragrant flowers that are white with a lemon-coloured labellum with red spotting.

This orchid takes a wide range of temperatures, in summer 12-25deg. C but can stand up to 35deg. and in winter 8 to 16 deg. C but can tolerate down to 3 deg.

It likes good air movement around the plant with ample water in summer and a drier winter, just enough water to stop pseudobulbs from shrivelling.



Ptero. repanda

Pterostylis repanda – *exhibited by Dimitrios Mitsios*

Unfortunatly I could not find very much information about this plant as it is only a recently named species named in 2017 that is endemic to New Calidonia.

It grows as a cool growing terrestrial. It is very similar to the Green-Hood orchid found in Australia.

Sophronitella violacea – *exhibited by Melissa Karayannis*



Sophro. violacea

Author's Note:

The small Genus of Isabelia has three members. I. violacea. I. pulchella and I. virginalis. Two of the Genus are shown here.



This plant is a very slow grower, needs good drainage so the roots can dry out

It is found in heavily shaded, mountainous, humid forests of Eastern Brazil.

A warm to cool creeping epiphyte, sometimes lithophytes it has densely

clustered pseudobulbs that have 1 or 2 acute leaves. The inflorescence is

Cork, tree fern or pieces of plants that don't lose their bark,

shorter than the leaves and has 1 to 4 pink flowers.

between watering so is best suited to mounting.

This is also called Isabelia violacea.

Callistemon (bottle brush) is the best, keep humid with regular watering if mounted, give bright light and good air movement.



Neo. pulchella

Neolauchea pulchella – *exhibited by George Birss*

Found in Southern Brazil in cool damp forests this miniature cool growing epiphyte grows from sea level to 1500 metres it has creeping, branching rhizome with narrow pseudobulbs with a single 5cm long leaf.

The thread like short inflorescence, have a single 1.5 to 2cm magenta coloured flower that is held among the leaves.

Best grown on a slab of tree fern or cork with moderate light and ample water will grow into a mat shape and looks best when grown into a specimen plant.



Dend. convallariiforme

Dendrochilum convallariiforme - exhibited by John Costa

This Dendrochilum is one of the "small" growing Dendrochilums.

It originates from The Philippines where it grows at elevations of 300 to 900 metres as a warm epiphyte.

The short oval pseudobulbs are 2.5 cm and have a single lanceolate leaf that is 10cm long and 2.5cm wide.

The gracefully arching inflorescence grows from new grow pseudobulbs and carries as many as 50fragrant, attractive flowers that spiral around the raceme. The flowers are salmon in colour and there is a green form that maybe an albino form.

Not quite as hardy as most Dendrochilum species but defiantly one of the most attractive with great colour, and the new leaves are a bronze colour until they mature.

GENERAL MEETING 10th July 2023

NEW MEMBERS: Applications for membership were received tonight from: *Nina Woodcock, Lee Strong and Lydia Chen.*

Tonight, we are looking forward to our annual plant auction which will be commencing after the break.

Rob Nicol motioned that the June Minutes as distributed in the July Bulletin, were accurate. *Melissa Karayannis* seconded the motion that they were correct. Carried.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

SSOS CONSTITUTION:

Rhonda presented a brief overview of the changes we are suggesting to our current Constitution, which was adopted back on 10^{th} Dec. 2012.

This follows advise from NSW Fair Trading that on 1 September 2022, a new Regulation for incorporated associations commenced.

This Regulation introduced a new model Constitution and we now have the option and opportunity to adopt the model constitution, or draft our own.

It was noted that the new model is very similar to our existing constitution with a few changes.

Committee reviewed both documents, and Rhonda asked members to consider adopting the new constitution with the recommended changes.

Members were then taken through the sections that we are suggesting to modify:

The proposed Constitution will be emailed or posted to all members for their consideration shortly after this meeting.

Once accepted by our members, it will be forwarded to the NSW Fair Trading for registration. A few printed copies were made available at the meeting.

ITEMS OF INTEREST:

WINTER SHOW

Financial Report – Rhonda handed over to our Treasurer Margaret Spring who presented an overview of the Winter Show results. Whilst we didn't make a profit this time round, Margaret emphasised the importance of holding these Shows being for the greater benefit of our members to be able to 'display' the results of all their hard work during the year. On completion, Rhonda thanked Margaret for the report, and for all the hard work with managing the show finances.

Show Report:

Rhonda addressed the members with the following report, then asking if anyone had any feedback. 'I'm sure you will agree that the Winter show was a success. I'd like thank the committee for all their efforts in ensuring it ran smoothly, as well as Bob Moar our Show Marshall. Col Brandon did a great job in assisting the judges when they made their decisions. George and Heath performed the repotting service which is greatly appreciated, as well as selling some of their wares. This year our volunteers were amazing with lots of members assisting. Seventeen members entered 135 plants in the display and 16 won a prize. The display looked fabulous. Attendance by the public was up and was steady throughout the show. Heath Myers won first prize in the raffle, with external people winning the remaining prizes. A big thank you to everyone who participated and assisted.


