Epidendrum porpax – *exhibited by Dimitrios Mitsios*

A vigorous, creeping and branching mini species, that forms large mats of clustered leafy stems and has no pseudobulbs. Found from Mexico to Peru.

The fleshy flowers resemble beetles or painted fingernails. The sepals and petals are insignificant and green in colour but the lip is the showy part being a glossy red / brown.

There is an alba form that is apple green in colour.

A fairly easy to grow orchid that requires little care and has few problems. Grown in a shallow saucer pot or mounted on cork or tree fern it is fairly tolerant and takes warm and cool conditions.

Give filtered bright light, dark conditions produce greener foliage and brighter light a reddish foliage. Keep moist but slightly drier in winter.

A rewarding unusual plant to have in a collection, takes little space and makes a great specimen.

Cymbidium tracyanum – *exhibited by Diane Phillips*

Originating from China, Thailand and Myanmar, it is found growing in tree trunk forks and on damp rocks on wooded slopes at elevations of 1200 to 1900 metres.

A larger growing cymbidium, with longish leaves and one-metre-long plus inflorescence. The arching inflorescence carries ten to twenty highly fragrant flowers.

There is a wide variation in colours from dark to light olive, green, cream with brown to red spots and stripes. A large, wavy, white to cream lip has red spots.

Cool growing with at least 12 hours of filtered sunlight in spring and summer. One of the very best cymbidiums species with many sort after varieties such as "Peach Perfume" or "Death Wish".

This plant is at its best when grown as a specimen plant. I have found it very touchy to divide.


Coelogyne Linda Buckley - exhibited by Jan Robinson

A primary hybrid, of Coelogyne mooreana and Coelogyne cristata.

The beautiful white and gold colouring of both the parents has carried through to this plant with the upright flower spike of C. mooreana and has inherited some of the wavery" sepals from C. cristata.

When making a Hybrid the idea is to produce a plant that has the best of its parents and Coelogyne Linda Buckley has achieved this.

Due to the different climates the parents come from this hybrid tolerates a wide growing temperature range.



Endemic to the Chinese Provinces of NW Guangxi and SE Yunnan growing at elevations of 1000 – 1300 metres, making it a warm to cool grower.

It is found on tree trunks as a small to medium sized epiphyte growing in the forest areas.

The plant has pendulous terete narrow leaves. The inflorescence carries up to six flowers that are white with pink features and a pink striped throat.

This plant is best grown in a basket or mounted to accommodate the pendulous features of the plant. Grow in intermediate conditions with moderately bright light. Water all year round but slightly less in winter.

A very attractive small plant, that would take up little space and have few problems but watch for mealy bug.



Holc. lingulatum

Stenorrhynchos speciosum – *exhibited by George Birss*

Greek for, narrow snout, horn or beak, referring to the narrow, rostellum on the column.

This is one of seven species in this genus. A terrestrial or epiphyte found in moist, low areas and steep embankments from Arizona to Texas, Cuba to Trinidad and Panama to Peru.

These tallish erect plants have Dark green to pale green leaves with silvery spots. The species in the north have plain green leaves.

The unbranched stem is densely packed with showy tubular flowers ranging in colour from red to crimson to salmon with a white tubular lip.

Easy to grow, I have mine in a heated glass house with year-round watering and fertiliser, less of both in the winter months. Showy and unusual with little care and no pest problems.

Plants will be checked prior to sale.

Reserve Pricing:

If a plant has a reserve price, write the word "**Reserve**" and the price on the tag. We will give you a yellow stick-on spot to stick onto your plant to indicate it has a reserve price.

Bidding:

The minimum opening bid per plant shall be \$10 with a minimum increase bid of \$1. An opening bid of less than \$10, shall be at the discretion of the Auctioneer.

Payment:

You will be paid less the 15% commission on the next meeting night. Club vouchers for the sales table can be used as payment in the auction. Purchases will be **CASH ONLY**

June Meeting Presentation

'Six of the 'Easier' Orchids to Grow'



At the June meeting we had the pleasure of Jan Robinson presenting her experiences and thoughts on six of what we generally acknowledge, are the easier orchid genera to grow and flower.

Jan has been growing orchids for over 20 years, is an OSNSW/AOC Judge and as we know a previous President of our Society.

Was this to be a straight forward cultural talk on these 6 orchids? – many of us thought so, but no it wasn't!

Jan started with a selection of plants that we generally consider 'easier to grow' than others, that is, being 'cool' or can generally survive without minimal 'winter heating' in a bush or covered shade house type environment, and requiring 'minimal' care.

So far so good, and at this point, many of our Novice growers at the meeting were now getting quite excited.

Jan then proceeded to discuss common pests (accompanied by some graphic photos), including damage from the dreaded dendrobium beetle (showing parent and larvae), soft and hard scale, mites, the white boisduval scale, aphids, and the destruction from the larger chewing pests like grasshoppers, millipedes (chomping roots), cockroaches, snails and slugs etc.

We were then led on a journey covering the topic of creating the ideal conditions or choosing the best locations for our plants i.e., offering best light and humidity for each type.

Then moving on to discuss some common orchid diseases (fungal and virus), black rot etc, again - accompanied by more graphic photos!

Lastly, presenting some examples of the fairly commonly cultivated Paph. insigne types.

Jan put up some statistics on these, mentioning that some plants had flowered well initially when purchased, but had not done so, (or had occasionally done so), for several years since. With some plants getting on to 10 years old!

Jan's solution was to try relocating some of these within her growing areas, and with great results. So, Jan's message here is 'to move your plants if not flowering'! and don't wait 10 years to do so!

Concluding, Jan's message was quite clear to us all, that there really aren't any 'easier to grow' orchids than others. No matter what genera you grow, they all require the right conditions, regular attention, close inspection for bugs, virus and fungal attack, and most of all, patience when not flowering at their best each year.

Thank-you Jan for this great insight into the world of successful orchid culture, (and the laughs along the way) Some great messages in there for those of us who believe we have 'the easiest ones to grow' in our collections! - £ditor

Rhonda asked if anyone was interested in driving the bus on the Friday to let us know. The estimate was \$10 - \$15 each for the bus.

WINTER SHOW: 16th and 17th lune

Show Schedule and Forms:

Recently you would have received an email with the show class schedule, booking-in sheet, native plant harvest return sheet and sales table requirements. If you didn't receive them, to please let David know.

Rhonda mentioned that we have some printed copies of the show schedule and booking-in sheets available tonight, and they will also be available at the venue.

Members were urged to take some plant booking in cards home to have them pre-completed.

Also, to help us promote the show, we still have a few flyers tonight available from the sales table, and urged members to please take some to distribute if they can.

Booking In Plants:

Members were reminded, that booking-in for the show is this Thursday (15^{th}), and that plants need to be brought to the venue between $2.30 \, \text{pm} - 5 \, \text{pm}$. We need a completed 'booking-in' sheet and benching card for each of your plants.

Rhonda also reminded everyone to please remove any awful looking leaves and dead sheaths, and importantly to check them for pests and diseases.

For those members entering a table top display in Class 1, you must book your space by phoning our Show Marshal Bob Moar. You will find Bob's contact number on the front of the show schedule. If you can help with the set-up on Thursday, it would be appreciated.

Sales Bench:

As mentioned last meeting, we are encouraging members to provide their own carry bags or trays when purchasing or selling from the sales bench.

Plants must be clean, tidy, pest and disease free. They must be well established in the pot and not been recently re-potted. All plants for the sales table will be inspected before they can be placed on the table, and that the committee reserves the right to remove any plant they consider is not suitable for sale.

Our preference is for you to use the white plastic 'loop lock' plant tags for your name and the price of the plant. They are on the sales bench.

All NSW native plants to be sold must have "Plantation Grown" on the tag with the plant name, and the harvest return sheet completed. If you need assistance with this, Col Brandon or Jan may be on hand. After the show you will need to tell Rhonda which NSW native plants did not sell.

The sales are cash only, so bring lots. The Society will take a commission of 15% from members who display plants in the show, and 20% if no plants are entered.

Members were reminded that the Society is not responsible for any losses arising from the sales table and members place plants on the sales table at their own risk.

WINTER SHOW VOLUNTEER ROSTER:

Rhonda reiterated that the show is for the benefit of our members, and one way you are able to participate is by volunteering your time.

As you know, the Society reserves the right to reject any plants not suitable for sale. You will be paid less the 15% commission on the next meeting night. Club vouchers for the sales table can be used as payment in the auction. Purchases will be CASH ONLY so bring plenty. There will be **no sales table** at the July meeting.




