Society Re-Potting / Promotional Day – May 3rd @ 11am

In Conjunction with Bunnings Kirrawee - 'Garden Corner'



A slightly reduced, but keen group of customers, attended our one-hour repotting demonstration session, held at Bunnings Kirrawee. on Wednesday $3^{\rm rd}$ May.

From the Society on the day, assisting our team leader Frank Daniel, were Rhonda Jackson, Margaret Spring and David Hicks.

Frank demonstrated the procedure for dividing and repotting cymbidiums, covering potting mixes, watering, providing appropriate shade conditions and types of fertilizers. Rhonda spoke about Australian natives, plus some tips on the long-term care for the Phalaenopsis orchids that are available at Bunnings. David and Margaret spoke about various other types of orchids that can also be grown 'cool' in the bush house.

Bunnings provided a number of orchid growing products and pots from their range, for us to refer to during the session.

Those attending asked a range of general and specific cultural questions, most had a cymbidium or two, with some having speciosums or other native orchids at home, one person even asked us about Stanhopeas!

We distributed copies of our Winter Show and Society Information Flyers and they sounded keen to attend our upcoming show.

Thank-you to Frank, as two attendees were very happy walking away with a re-potted cymbidium, and our appreciation to Bunnings for their generous gift of sponsorship towards our winter show prize money.

Bulbophyllum rothschildianum - exhibited by Wal Chapman

A miniature orchid from Yunnan Province in China, NE India, Assam & Myanmar where it grows on trees in lowland forests at elevations of 0 to 300 metres making it a warm to cool grower.

Flowers form an umbrella or fan shape, are cream background in colour with burgundy spots covering the entire flower. They have a distinctive rocking lip that is solid burgundy in colour and have a small hairy dorsal.

This species is grown in a pot or basket with a free draining mix. Wal's orchid and many well grown ones I have seen prefer shallow tray pots as they have short roots.

They prefer mild light, good air movement, high humidity and regular watering. Easy to grow with few problems and give a rewarding display when in flower.

<u>Author's Note:</u> There has been considerable discussion recently and an article by Justin Lee 'suggests' that most Bulbophyllum rothschildianum plants in Australia are actually a primary hybrid named Bulbophyllum Vindobona which is a cross between B. ornatissimum & B. rothschildianum.

Apparently, there are a number of differences, one being the texture of the petals, one is smooth, one is covered in small pimples.

I have only recently heard of this variance in the plants and I am not suggesting Wal's plant is one or the other. Maybe Murray Aldridge or even Wal can explain the difference of even if they are actually the same genus.



Coel. fimbriata

Coelogyne fimbriata – *exhibited by Diane Phillips*

With DNA and modern techniques in sorting varieties Coelogyne fimbriata, C. fuliginosa, C. ovalis, C. pallens and C. pangenesis it is suggested that all could be reduced to one species name Coelogyne fimbriata.



Sigmatostalix radicans

Sigmatostalix radicans – *exhibited by George Birss*

Other genus names Ornithophora radicans & Gomesa radicans A native of Brazil found near the coast at around 400m as a miniature epiphyte that grows warm.

It has small pseudobulbs that have grass like leaves. From the pseudobulbs emerge the slender branching inflorescence that carry many scented yellow – greenish flowers that have a large lip for the small flower.

They like bright defused light, high humidity and year-round watering, slightly less in winter.

In Sydney, I grow mine mounted on tree fern under shade cloth in my green house. I have recently tried pieces in a Stanhopea mesh basket lined with coir and bark medium, growing well at present. Not commonly seen on the sales bench but a great little plant if you can get it.

Coel. fuliginosa

Coelogyne fuliginosa – exhibited by Russell Ettrick

A medium to cool epiphyte or lithophytes that grows on limestone cliffs in crevasses and is found throughout most of SE Asia from sea level to 1500m.

With small elliptical pseudobulbs that carry two leaves. Inflorescences appear on new mature pseudobulbs and carry 1 to 3 flowers.

The flowers range in colours from cream to greenish yellow to bronze and almost brown with a large darked hairy lip.

A tough, easy to grow orchid, that produces numerous flowers, over several months.

Can be grown in pots baskets or mounted on slabs of tree fern.



Max. cucullata

Maxillaria cucullata - exhibited by Melissa Karayannis


A species from Mexico and Central America, grow at elevations from 700 to 3300m in damp, misty rain forests.

This warm to cool growing epiphyte, lithophytes or terrestrial has small pseudobulbs with a single leaf.

From mature pseudobulbs arise a 7 to 17cm inflorescence that holds a single fragrant flower.

Flower colour is yellow with brown spots towards the centre but can vary with different clones to reds and browns. The lip is dark to almost black.

The sepals tend to fold in to act as a hood over the lip.



First named in 1897 for Queen Victoria.

Endemic to the Philippines, found growing in dense mossy, rain forests, at elevations of 1300 to 2700m as a cool epiphyte.

Growing with their roots embedded in moss, with plenty of air movement, the stems are very narrow at the base resulting in the plant growing pendulous in nature.

Plants can bloom at any time of the year and appear on mature canes that have shed most of their foliage, canes can be bare and old canes can flower for several seasons.

Flowers appear in clusters along the stems usually in 1 to 3. The colours can vary in colour intensity but are a superb blue – lavender indigo with white in the centre with radiating darker veins up the petals and lip.

As they grow in moss in nature, I have transferred my three plants to water well pots and in spag moss and they are going well and all three are different shades violet.

They grow under 50% shade cloth and hang high having good air, high humidity and bright mottled light white staying moist.



Also providing invaluable advice on the 'safer' chemicals to spray and some effective systemic types as well The second part of Jane's talk concentrated on identifying diseases, fungal types, and identifying some of the more common viruses, accompanied with a great selection of photos showing the various leaf markings. Our members asked many questions as this is a such an important aspect to be on top of, for successful orchid culture.

On conclusion, Rhonda expressed our sincere gratitude to Jane for travelling up from Canberra to give us such a great insight into these topics, and presented our gifts of appreciation to a hearty round of applause from our members.


