Thecostele alata – *exhibited by Laurence Watkins*

This is a fascinating species that I have never seen benched before.

Found from Myanmar through to Vietnam to the Philippines growing from 0 to 1800m as a small sized warm to hot epiphyte that grows in lowland forests.

It has clustered pseudobulbs that carry a single leaf. Arising from the base of the pseudobulb the inflorescences slender and branches and can have 20 to 40 flowers.

As the flowers start to open the inflorescence lengthens and new flowers arrive and can last 2 -3 months.

The insect like flowers are highly scented.

Best grown in wood baskets to accommodate the pendulous inflorescence.

Cattleya forbesii - exhibited by Pam Davies

This species from Brazil grows at around 200metres as a cool to warm epiphyte or lithophyte on trees or rocks near streams.

With slightly swollen pseudobulbs that carry two leaves the 10 to 15cm inflorescence can hold 1 to 6 scented, waxy flowers that can come in a variety of colours.

This plant will grow well mounted as they are found naturally on growing on trees where they get their nutrients from the air and decaying matter that collects around the rhizomes.

If potted use a large bark for quick drainage.

Give good air circulation and humid environment and do not let the plant dry out.

Dend. fuerstenbergianum - exhibited by Jan Robinson

Named in 1907 after a German Count and orchid enthusiast, from the late 1800's.

A stunning species from Thailand, that grows at elevations of 1300 to 1400 metres.

With 4 to 7 leaves the hairy stems produce a short inflorescence that has a single flower.

The inflorescence can come from a leafless stem also.

The crystalline white flower is stunning and emphasises the broad white lip with yellow / orange / red markings.

Kew also accepts the name Dendrobium christyanum.

A species from Sulawesi and Borneo, growing at elevations of 600 to 1200 metres, as a warm to cool epiphyte.

The 50cm oval pseudobulbs, carry one 30cm leathery, dull green leaf and then produce an erect 30cm spike that carries a single flower at a time successively opening one approx. each month for as many as ten flowers.

The flower has a tall lateral petal two slightly reflexing sepals and two very long drooping petals.

The petals and sepals are a glossy cream with reddish stripes.

The large glandular lip is dark red to purple and 'warty'.

Requires warm conditions, good air circulation, high humidity and frequent watering.

Dend. lawesii var. bicolor – exhibited by D. Mitsios, J. Robinson, G. Birss

A fantastic species from Papua & New Guinea & Bougainville Islands, found in misty forests in shady conditions growing at 800 to 1200 metres as a warm to cool growing epiphyte.

With long skinny canes that grow upright but can arch gracefully develops clusters of flowers along the canes and can flower on new or old canes.

They tend to drop leaves after flowering. Canes can bloom for several years and can flower at any time of year.

The bi colour plants are red and yellow or red and white but there are also single colour lawesii of red, yellow or violet/pink and these have a white throat.

I have found that this genus is very finicky if re potted and either sulks or dies. Keep moist, but drier in winter, good air circulation and high humidity.

I am growing in spag and a water well pot, so far so good.



Phal. violacea var.

Phal. violacea var. Sumatra – exhibited by W & J Chapman

This strain of P. violacea comes from the Island of Sumatra and the flowers tend to be fuller and more brilliantly coloured.

The flower is rose / purple with varying degrees of green at the tips of the petals and sepals.

The lip is two part with the end very dark violet. The flowers are waxy and long lasting and extremely fragrant with a spicy cinnamon fragrance.

They are sequential flowering and will continue to throw new flowers on the same flower spike.

As they come from a low altitude of 0 to 150 metres, they require heated conditions.

They are epiphytes and found on trees in shaded moist tropical forests

A species that grows in the humid forests, from the coast to the central plateau of Madagascar, at elevations up to 1200 metres as a warm epiphyte.

The wiry flower spike can be short or extremely long up to a metre causing it to be pendulous.

With 1 or 2 bizarre emerald green or yellow or white flowers that are long lasting and fragrant with a sweet butter scent that is stronger in the evening.

Do not cut the old flowers off even if they look dead until the inflorescence is dry and brittle as it can re bloom or throw keikis.

These plants like the conditions given to Phalaenopsis.

Phal. fasciata - exhibited by W & J Chapman

Endemic to the Philippines, this warm growing epiphyte, is found on trees near rivers and streams at around 500 metres elevation.

This genus has zig zag inflorescence where it produced many rose fragrant waxy flowers. The inflorescence can re produce flowers for many years, so don't remove unless dead.

The flowers are yellow / green with brown lines on the petals and sepals. *'Fasciatus'* is Latin meaning banded or striped.

Growing requirements are a hot house or very warm conditions, plenty of water, humid conditions and good air movement around the plant.

The only pest is usually mealy bug.

February's Meeting Presentation

For those members who missed last meeting, we were treated to a most interesting and informative talk by Martin Davies on Coelogynes.

Whilst not his main genera of interest, he finds the beautiful flowers very worthwhile as part of his collection, and says they grow well in spaces of the bush-house that he doesn't normally use.

Martin brought along a selection of some great specimen sized examples, showing us the success, he is having by growing them in water-well pots.

This type of pot is particularly well suited to liquid fertilizers, which Martin advised he uses various types.

As a consequence, we noted the enormous size of some of the bulbs compared to what we normally see in standard pot culture.

One Coelogyne Martin advised he has found 'difficult 'over the years, is Coel. cristata.

Rhonda had brought along an example for Martin's scrutiny, which was growing OK with new growths, but the bulbs appeared quite shrivelled for this time of the season.

Martin advised Rhonda to try repotting it into a water-well pot, and we look forward to hearing of the results!

Many thanks Martin for taking the time to share your knowledge and experiences with us tonight, quite sure many members will now go home and revise how they cultivate their own plants!

Special thank-you also to Joy Gouvoussis for assisting Martin to pass the plants around as he was talking. - *Editor*

Rhonda raised a news item from last Wednesday, where 900 of WA's rarest orchids were stolen from the Conservation Garden in Kings Park in Perth. The majority of 400 Carbunup King Spider orchids (Caladenia procera) and 500 Collie Spider orchids (Caladenia leucochila) were removed or destroyed. If members see or hear of any of the orchids for sale, to please contact Crime Stoppers WA.

There was also mention that Chris Gray had kindly donated some of his orchids, pots and trays to the Society. The raffle tonight will be a bonus raffle with some of Chris' orchids.

Rhonda thanked Chris on behalf of the Society for his most generous donation.

Whilst the Judges were busy finalizing their choices before the break -Rhonda mentioned that her speciosum hillii is looking great as the new growths have not been attacked by Dendrobium Beetles this year.

She sprayed it with Neem Oil starting in mid-August every two weeks a few times, and again in mid-January three or four times.

It should be noted to take care on sunny days so that it doesn't get burnt from the oil! Thank-you Rhonda for the tips!

GUEST SPEAKER:

After the break, Rhonda handed over the meeting to our guest speaker, Martin Davies, who gave us a great insight into growing Coelogynes, bringing along many examples for us to see just how well they do in water-well pots.

Martin also touched on the difficulties with Coel. cristata and gave some useful tips to Rhonda who had brought along a troublesome example.
