#### Speaker at our August Meeting - Richie Dimon The Orchid Conservation Programme









Richie Dimon, formally a research assistant at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Victoria is now undertaking a PhD and working as a Technical Officer at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Sydney.

As guest speaker for August, Richie took us on an amazing journey, presenting us with an incredibly fascinating talk on methodologies and conservation efforts regarding listed threatened Australian terrestrial orchids.

Accompanied by a presentation of very detailed PowerPoint <sup>®</sup> slides, we were taken through the steps required to conserve and enhance populations of threatened terrestrial orchids, some of which are critically endangered and possibly down to only a few hundred individuals in the wild.

It was quite an education to witness the very labour-intensive efforts by the conservation teams working in the laboratories and nurseries.

Richie explained the steps of hand-pollination and seed collection, and the fact that these orchids have developed a very close and specific mutualistic relationships with fungi. In most cases, the orchid seed cannot germinate without the presence of the fungi which penetrates the orchid root system (mycorrhizal fungi).

We thank-you Richie for your most interesting and informative talk, but as we don't have the space here to compliment and detail all the aspects, we hopefully will be able to provide a link to the full presentation on our Website at a future date.

Australian Ginger is D. striolatum X D. fuliginosum Registered in Dec 2003 by Down Under Native Orchids Down Under Native Orchids was an orchid nursery in the Gosford area and was originally owned by *Brian Gurhard*.

**DOCKRILLIA** - was named after Alick Dockrill an Australian orchidologist and author. The genus Dockrillia was created in 1981 to take in fleshy leaved species in the Dendrobium section known as pencil orchids, terete leaved or rat-tailed species of the genus.

These orchids are epiphytes, usually pendulous with wiry rhizomes and no pseudobulbs. In the wild their roots attach firmly to tree branches, usually on the southern sides along with lichen.

They have a preference to casuarina trees often rear creeks as they like the humidity. They have in most cases fleshy, succulent leaves often circular in cross section. The many flowers are carried on branching inflorescence that arise from near the leaf base.

Most species are from Australia with two notable ones from PNG, those being D. fuliginosa and D. convolute which have been crossed with the Australian group to achieve colours.

Different from normal Australian Dendrobiums is that the leaves have been 'fused' to form a solid tube or rat's tail. Another notable difference is the blooms are upside down. They are found from SE Tasmania to Cape York and the islands above and PNG. (*cont'd next page*)

They can be grown in shallow or small pots, trays or mounted on black Cyathea tree fern or cork.

Dendrobiums or Dockrillia these are a fascinating orchid to grow and as you can see from above make great specimens, although it does take a while to achieve a large plant.

#### Chiloglottis truncata QLD – exhibited by Richie Dimon





Commonly known as "small ant orchid"

First described by David Jones and Mark Clements, in 1987, from a species collected at Anduramba.

It grows in forests and woodlands between Kingaroy and Toowoomba at elevations of 200 to 600 metres in moist areas.

This orchid is a terrestrial, perennial and deciduous herb with two leaves 50 – 60 mm long and 15 mm wide. The dorsal sepals are 10 – 11mm and 2mm wide. Lateral sepals are long but point downwards.

The labellum is trowel shaped, 8mm long and 4mm wide with a square cut tip with a shiny black insect like callus extending to the lip.

Growing in cultivation would be in a terrestrial mix of soil, leaf litter, sand and peat. Keep the mix moist in growing season and reduce watering as leaves die off.

Maxillaria nigrescens - exhibited by W & J Chapman



A species orchid from Columbia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru & Bolivia growing in rain forest areas at elevations of 1500 to 2700 metres as a cool growing epiphyte.

Maxillarias always produce solitary flowers that emerge from the base of mature pseudobulb. With this type the inflorescence is about 15cm long with a single 5cm flower.

The sepals and petals are burnt orange to reddish with darker colouring towards the centre of the flower and the lip.

Cultivated in pots or dishes of fine bark or spag moss or mounted on tree fern or cork. Keep moist with a drier winter.

# **Dendrobium Beetle** – Stethopachys formosa

Around this time every year the grumblings and photo's start appearing with this dreaded little pest arriving in our collections to commence destroying all our good work during the year.

There are literally hundreds of articles and forums out there on this subject, but no one real effective control!

Many growers say try this spray and that spray, but really many growers just say forget sprays, mechanical prevention is the safest and only way- i.e., seal your greenhouse, cover your buds with nets, physically collect them in a jar by placing it underneath as they drop off the leaf.

I guess if we want our plants to make it to the Show, that's what we have to do!

Anyhow, at least being able to identify them in your collections by the various life cycle stages, or the damage they do on your plants might be a good start.

Most of us know what the adult looks like, but may not be aware of the eggs and larvae stage that we find amongst our leaves and bulbs

Phil Spence It is impossible to summarise Phil Spence's lifetime with orchids into a few words. He is an authority on the orchids of PNG; he has been a major producer of new orchid hydrids, especially *Dendrobium*; he is an Honorary Research Associate of the Herbarium of the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney; he was the recipient of the AOF Award of Honour in 2013. In addition, he has lectured around the world and has just completed a new book on *Dendrobium* section *Latourea* which will be released shortly.

#### His topic: Dendrobium Sect. Latouria

Phil will speak about his *Latouria* book which is being published by the American Orchid Society and sponsored by the Australian Orchid Foundation. Phil will introduce the book to us, its contents including some species which are new to science and give us some background information on its writing and production.
