Well, the changeable Spring weather is here, some days beautiful and warm, even tending to hot, then a cool snap for a couple of days with some rain which is always welcome.

This warmer weather is definitely good for orchid growers, not only are plants blooming all over the place but it encourages you to get out and start re potting!

My soft cane dendrobiums are all in flower and you forget what a stunning arrangement of colours for an orchid that takes very little looking after, even though I have to re pot all of mine when flowering finishes and the dendrobium beetle seem to neglect even though they are dendrobiums.

Another orchid that gives very few problems that are blooming their heads off at the moment is Sarcochilus.

Thankfully to one of our old members, Neville Roper, who crossed some many to develop new colours and better, bigger flowers now instead of just white with red centres we have yellows, pinks, reds, tans and oranges with spots, stripes and freckles.

To get an effect with Sarcs you have to either grow to a specimen with 12 spikes or more or better still have a variety of plants, at least 12 plants and mass together with various colours



Wandering around I have noticed some of the pendulous dendrobiums are starting to bud up, things like Den. perradii, Den. loddigesii, Den. primulinum and D. Bohemian Rapsody.

These look magnificent when their canes reach about 60cm or more and hang down covered in purple / pink and white flowers another plant that requires little maintenance for a great reward and they have few bug problems hanging high in the shade house.

I have had my best flowering this year of Dend. amethystoglossum, with 15 flower spikes on 7 canes.

Beautiful bunches of white flowers with a purple lip. In previous years I have had trouble with garlic snails, then small caterpillars then aphids but this year I beat them all.

Another dendrobium I am flowering at present is Dendrobium tangerinum, this is one of the "twistie" dendrobes with the petals and sepals twisting to resemble antlers. It is in a 100mm pot and has 60cm canes and a 30cm inflorescence carrying 20 rusty / gold flowers.

It is a hot house plant and I sit it in a tray of water to maintain water to the plant and for humidity.

While checking the hot house I noticed an Australian native in flower, Dendrobium canaliculatum, with stout stubby pseudobulbs and stiff narrow leaves with a shout inflorescence that carries up to ten brilliant flowers that have white and yellow/green sepals and petals and a vibrant purple lip.

Winter temps must be above 10 deg. Celsius and drier and plenty of water in summer.

Indian dendrobiums, the likes of densiflorum, farmerii, thyrsiflorum and notable primary hybrid Mousmee (cross between two species D. amabile and D. thyrsiflorum) are all in bloom or bud with their striking "bunch of grape" type flowers of gold, yellow and white and Mousmee with a lavender/mauve blush.

These plants are very showy even spectacular but hard to get to shows in their peak as flowers only last about a week, but still worth having in your collection. Another SE Asian dendrobium that is putting on a great show at present is Dendrobium fimbriatum with bunches of bright gold flowers and also Dendrobium fimbriatum var. occulatum which has gold flowers also but has a black "eye" in the centre. Both plants brighten any greenhouse but can get large with metre long canes.

Coelogynes are still flowering and I have a lovely Janine Banks out at present which is pure white with a gold throat. This is not a pendulous type but has upright spikes.

Although things are looking great don't be misled because with the heat and humidity comes scale and mealy bug and aphids love new little buds, check regularly and watch for snails and slugs if wet.

Dendrobium Beetles are around now and love eating new flowers and boring into canes to lay their eggs
