#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

#### 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024

#### Dear SSOS Members,

I send my apologies for not attending the AGM.

We have had a full and busy year and I'd like to give an overview of what has been achieved. We had a high standard of guest speakers at our meetings, who presented on a range of topics. Our speakers were Martin Davies, David Brooks, Dr Jane Wright, Jan Robinson, Sarah from Yates, Adrian O'Malley, Barbra and George Kypriotis, and myself. We enjoyed their talks thoroughly.

In April, well deserved recognition was given to Frank Daniel in being awarded a Life Membership to the Society.

We renewed our Growers Licence in August, updated our Constitution in September, and developed a Code of Conduct in December.

We are very pleased to have welcomed 13 new members this year. We hope their membership is a rewarding experience for them. This is very positive considering other societies have declining memberships. We were saddened when we lost Lee Buivids in April. Lee was a champion grower who had been a member for many years.

The number of plants benched at our meetings in the December 22 to November 23 period was 844. The classes with the most plants benched were Class 3, Australian Native Hybrids and Class 9, Miscellaneous Hybrids both with 67 plants.

The month with the most plants benched was October with 126 plants.

At our June show, 17 members exhibited 134 plants, and in September 16 members exhibited 171 plants. We held growers group meetings in April and November where members received valuable orchid advice and instruction.

Promotion of our shows and Society occurred when we held potting demonstrations at Bunnings Kirrawee and Caringbah and participated in their Spring Launch days.

We presented to the members of Caringbah Garden Club at their November meeting.

We are very proud to have 5 members who are currently completing the OSNSW Orchid Appreciation course.

I'd like to thank the committee for their contribution towards the successful running of Society. With our enthusiastic committee you can be confident that the Society is well run for the benefit of all members.

And finally, I'd like to thank our members who attend our meetings, especially those who put out and put away the tables and chairs, bring plants to be judged, and to be sold on the sales table, collect the plant cards and record the results, sell raffle tickets, judge our plants and perform the other tasks to make the meetings an enjoyable experience for all.

## TREASURER'S REPORT (2023)

#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

#### 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Throughout 2023, your committee has kept a watchful eye on the accounts and are committed to using our funds to maintain and promote the growing of orchids, to benefit and advance our Society and support and encourage the members. 2023 could be seen as a year of returns: to our Annual Plant Auction, to both Winter and Spring Shows and to the regular attendance of many members at our Monthly Meetings. In a financial sense, 2023 was still a challenge with both our Shows incurring a loss.

We began the year with a balance of \$18,821.29. Our income for 2023 was \$7,158.10 an increase on 2022. Our expenditure of \$11,194.75 left us with a shortfall of \$4036.65 but thankfully by the good management of our predecessors we still have money in the bank, our closing balance being \$14,784.64. Our big-ticket items are prize money and Bunnings vouchers, printing, stationery and name badges, hall rental and raffle costs whilst our membership fees barely cover the cost of the insurance which we must hold.

It has been decided that we will return the prize money offered at our Shows to 2022 levels and to ask new members to bear the cost of their name badge. Your committee monitors our finances month by month and will make adjustments where necessary or appropriate.

I'd like to thank Jan Robinson for her assistance in putting the Annual Report together, Di Philips and Rob Nicol for manning the Sales Bench each month, Robert Cawley our ever-reliable raffle ticket seller and our members who support our raffles and buy and sell through our Sales Bench. I know that raffle tickets are purchased in hopes of winning a prize but I'm also aware that folk see it as a way of supporting our Society. The income from our raffles and commission from the sales Bench are vital for our bottom line and especially for out Winter and Spring Shows so thank you.

We have had a number of new members join our society, new folk on our committee and five members completing the Judges Course which should ensure our continuance and progress. I wish the Society well for 2024.
