GENERAL MEETING

9th September 2024

President extended a very warm welcome to everyone, and declared the general meeting open at 8pm.

MINUTES:

Robert Nicol motioned that the August Minutes as distributed in the September Bulletin, were accurate were correct. Seconded by *Russell Ettrick*. Carried.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

UPDATING PUBLIC OFFICER WITH ATO:

As Contact Officer with the ATO, Rhonda offered to complete the NFP return with the assistance of our Treasurer. However, she didn't have access to commence the NFP return process as the registered Public Officer with ATO needs to complete it.

The Society needs to advise ATO of the appointment of our Public Officer at the same time as notifying the Office of Fair Trading. Our Society has not notified ATO for a very long time. It is not known who the current registered Public Officer is with the ATO as, due to privacy concerns, ATO would not advise what name is recorded. They confirmed it is not David Hicks, Rhonda Jackson, Louise Gannon nor Audrey Marks. Future AGM minutes need to record a motion for the formal appointment of the Public Officer.

A letter, *Change of registration details* form updating our "associate's" details, signed March AGM minutes by the proposed Public Officer and current contact officer (David and Rhonda) was posted to ATO. The ATO will take up to 28 days to action these documents.

On his return, David will commence the process and complete the NFP return, with assistance of Rhonda and Margaret. The NFP return is due on 31 October.

BUSHCARE EVENT 2024:

SSC Bushcare is holding their *Bushcare Fair* at Parc Menai on this Sunday 15th September 10am - 2pm. Frank will be attending with Rhonda. Another person was call for to attend and Gary Hodder accepted.

PA SYSTEM:

Due to the difficulties in hearing our guest speaker at times, after the meeting Paul Sheaffe looked at the PA system and noticed the settings were at incorrect levels. We now know what settings they should be on. Hopefully this will improve the quality of the sound.

SPONSORSHIP OF AOC 2025 INTERNATIONAL ORCHID CONFERENCE:

It was mentioned last meeting that the Society had received a request for sponsorship from Woolgoolga Orchid Society who are hosting the first regional AOC Conference in 2025.

They are seeking sponsorship from Orchid Societies and organisations as the cost of holding the event is \$120,000. The committee agreed to sponsor the amount of \$200 for 4 classes at \$50 per class of Australian Natives, or other genera depending on what is available.

INVITATION TO SPEAK AT CARINGBAH PROBUS ON 18 NOVEMBER: Unfortunately, no interest in presenting at PROBUS was received from the membership and committee, so we are not able to accept their invitation.

ORCHID SEED PODS: The President asked at the meeting what do with the seed pods that develop on orchids, especially plants not in greenhouses. The consensus was to cut them off and dispose of them. Other option is to wait until they mature and send them for flasking but unless you know the parentage there is not much point.

This question was asked in the Novice Group in Jan 2021. The response was "Naturally" created seed pods are probably not what you want and usually for growers will not germinate.

If you want to try, wait until the pod is "ripe" (changes colour or splits) sprinkle the seed on moist sphagnum moss, mist with water and enclose the whole thing in a transparent plastic bag. You can get lucky."

lan has called Lord Howe Island home for most of his adult life. Lord Howe Island has a resident population of only 380 people, and the number of tourists is capped at 400 at any one time. He is involved in a range of research projects focussing on the flora, fauna and geology of the Island. He spends a lot of time photographing, both above and below the water, and uses these photographs in weekly lectures, and in the books he has published.

In 2002 he was appointed as the part-time curator of the Lord Howe Island Museum and in that role has overseen and co-ordinated many changes during the last twenty years. He has been involved in initiating several conservation projects on the island, including weed and rodent eradication, and studies of climate change.

His topic: Orchid Fever on Lord Howe Island

Including a few surprise stories about the island and its orchids

lan has been involved with the AOF project 349.2022, "The taxonomic phylogenetic and conservation status of orchids of Lord Howe Island", with Dr Heidi Zimmer, CSIRO Canberra.

Local Orchid Spotting in September

Den. teretifolium

On a recent trip to the south coast, I surprisingly came across two colonies of Den. teretifolium growing happily on the Casuarina glauca outcrops which dominate in the scrub areas in and around Narrawallee Beach (near Mollymook) and the other area, around the Badgee Creek Bridge at Sussex Inlet.

Both observations were made very close to the main public tracks to the beach and lake, with some plants being quite large, and showing signs of recent flowering, also with a number of seed pods present. (lower right photo)

They must have been a great sight in full flower!

Many years ago, I observed them in huge numbers around the Durras Lake area, but was certainly surprised to see them in these areas which I have frequented many times over the years, and never really thought to 'look up' for them.

I know observing this species in our south coast areas is not something new to many members, and have published many of your observations of other native orchids and terrestrials, but am really happy to at least be able to share this one! - $\mathcal{D}avid$
