From the Benching in May - Maxillaria schunkeana

A dark flowered species - exhibited in Class 27 by D. Mitsios and V. Petrovski



Maxillaria schunkeana (syn. Brasiliorchis schunkeana) is a species orchid.

The colours of its flower are very close to black, but it is actually a very dark purple-red, giving the impression of a black flower.

The plant is endemic to the rainforests of Espiritu Santo State, Brazil at elevations of 600 to 700 meters.

Temperature:

It is an intermediate / intermediate-cold greenhouse species (depends on specimen to specimen), and does not adapt much to high temperatures. Recommended $18 - 22 \,^{\circ}$ C during the day. The minimum night temperature ideally is $10 - 15 \,^{\circ}$ C. During the summer it can be suitable to keep outdoors, placing it in a bright place (but without direct sunlight), ventilated and protected

from heavy rains and winds.

Humidity

Being cultivated in a pot, this species is not demanding regarding the humidity of the air, and is content with 50 - 60%. If instead it is cultivated with bare root, the humidity of the air should be at least 75%.

The 'Magic' of Specimen Orchids

Many orchid lovers, being either casual observers, novice, intermediate or open growers dream of having in their group that one special plant that is the pride of your collection.

That special orchid that **always** gets your priority attention. The first plant to be watered, the first to be fertilised or repotted, the first to be pruned and or moved to protection if the weather warning justifies and finally the first inspected for insect attack, mould, virus or anything that may harm your special orchid. Make no bones about it, this is your crowning glory and **nothing** will stop you preening this orchid, this specimen orchid, as the master of all your collection. It demands attention and perfection and you are the willing servant to its needs, because a specimen orchid reigns supreme in your collection.

Nothing is more satisfying, as you walk into that monthly meeting or that special winter/spring show, and all people around you stop and stare at the magnificence of your special orchid (*specimen orchid*) is carried into the room for display, admiration and competition and accreditation.

You are not smug or conceited or arrogant, but you just **know** your specimen orchid (being either Jan's Big Ben or Wal's Elizabeth Ann Buckleberry) that you are carrying into the room a winner, a champion, a **Bonafede** envy of **every** person in that room.

Victory can be sweet without even looking at the competition, because you have a specimen orchid at the peak of its flowering powers. You have a specimen orchid that has growth of outstanding measurements that all others wish for. You have a specimen orchid of such health and vigour that all others in your category wish they'd come at a later date and not be judged against you at the same time/day.

But being in this position did not come easy or overnight. To get a specimen plant can take you <u>years</u> to reach and that's the catch, that's the skill you need to acquire. You will need patience, durability, knowledge and a willingness to adapt to lighting, potting mix, pot type/style, a willingness to listen to the wisdom of your betters and above all else... Luck!

Firstly - you will need to find an orchid that you love to grow, an orchid that suits your growing environment (glass house, shade house, indoors or dappled light outside).

Secondly - you will need to find the perfect location in your growing environment that is 'just right' for that orchid. This will need you to constantly realise you will have to move your orchid around that glass house or shade house until you locate a position that your orchid is happy with. When you do, don't move it! (cont'd)

Thirdly - ensure the right potting mix for that orchid and ensure the right pot for that orchid (either a free draining mixture or a rich organic mix whatever that plant requires).

Fourthly - ensure correct water and fertiliser requirements are strictly adhered to.

Fifth - time and patience are essential for your specimen orchid to flourish. If you adhere to all the above suggested guidance points then insect, virus and/or mould will not be a factor you will need to address.

Just a hint - the bringing of your favoured orchid into being the specimen orchid of your collection will defiantly take **years** to achieve, that is why they are so stunning to view and why they are usually the envy of the show because it takes **years** to grow and reach their zenith of flowering triumph.

You cannot hurry the process. You cannot place your potential specimen orchid in larger than necessary pot size, you cannot give your potential specimen orchid extra water or extra fertiliser or extra sun/shade or move to a different location hoping to hurry up their growth.

Because you will fail, you will crash and burn and you will be faced with either a dead or dying potential specimen orchid and you will have to begin the process of growing a specimen orchid from scratch.

That is a situation you don't want to face.

There is a reason these wonderful plants are called 'specimen' orchids, because it takes a special patient kind of grower to produce a specimen orchid, an orchid that takes your breath away - an orchid you too can achieve!

What sparked your interest in orchids?


Were you given a gift of an orchid, did you by chance go to an orchid show, did you go for a walk in the bush one day and notice some fascinating, intricate flowers?
