Chelsea Flower Show 2025 Re: Professor Kingsley Dixon – Gold Medal Award

You may recall my request last January for funding to assist Prof Kingsley Dixon with a display at the Chelsea Flower Show.

Unfortunately, we couldn't raise the required funds for the proposed Orchid Gami, however, Kingsley proceeded to put on a display of Australian Terrestrial orchids with the theme conservation of Australian native orchids.

You will be pleased to know that Kingsley was awarded a Gold Medal for Conservation at the Show last week (in conjunction with Hong Kong and Singapore) for the display of Australian Orchids. Much-deserved recognition of his efforts with the conservation of the Australian orchids.

The AOF, as a major sponsor of Kingsley's research and conservation efforts, is delighted with the success that Kingsley has had with his display at Chelsea as it focusses local and international attention on the plight of Australia's orchid populations and the attempts being made to preserve our orchid heritage.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

The President thanked Melissa Karayannis for conducting the May meeting.

She also thanked David Hicks and Margaret Spring who willingly helped our new Treasurer with coming on board with our processes.

Our judges have asked that our three trainee judges accompany them at the meetings which left the President without a note taker. Robin Bannell, a new member and committee member kindly agreed to assist her.

AUCTION: Rhonda delivered a report on last month's auction. 13 members provided 62 plants, which resulted in total sales of \$2,085. The Society's commission was \$312. The highest sale price was \$75 and minimum sale was \$10. Rhonda thanked all members who put plants up for sale and to our auction team.

GOLD MEDAL AWARDED AT CHELSEA FLOWER SHOW: In February the AOF sought funding to assist Professor Kingsley Dixon with a display at the Chelsea Flower Show and to develop an Orchid Gami project. The Society pledged \$75, but as they couldn't raise the required funds it couldn't be pursued. However, Prof. Dixon proceeded to put on a display of Australian Terrestrial orchids with the theme *Conservation of Australian Native Orchids*. GENERAL MEETING 9th June 2025

When the AOF sent out the minutes of the AGM plus other documents, they sought donations from Societies to go towards the work they do. The committee has agreed to donate \$75 to the AOF.

OUR WINTER SHOW 2025:

Our show is being held on Friday 20th from 10am to 4pm and on Saturday 21st from 10am to 2pm, with set up on Thursday 19th from 2pm.

Show Documents:

David emailed the show documents to all members. They included Show Schedule, booking-in sheet, native plant harvest return sheet and requirements, and sales table requirements.

Volunteer Roster:

As the Society has a number of new members, Rhonda went over the various roles undertaken at the show, such as sales table, raffle sales and plant security. She sought the support of the members in volunteering to enable the show to be a success.

This year orchid supplies will not be sold at the show. However, we still we need to run with the repotting as a lot of the residents will ask for their plants to be repotted. Richie Dimon will provide two large plants to be repotted – a Bifrenaria harrisoniae and Oncidium sphacelatum. Thank you, Richie. These plants will be repotted at around 11am on each day. A small fee will be charged to cover the cost of the mix etc. Rhonda asked members to volunteer for the repotting timeslots.

Those who volunteer will be sent a copy of the roster prior to the show as a reminder. Volunteers will be in the running for one of three prizes from the draw at the Xmas meeting.

Plant Booking In:

The plants need to be brought to Woolooware Shore Retirement Village between 2.00pm – 5pm on Thursday. Rhonda asked for any awful leaves and dead sheaths from your plants to be removed, and to check them for pests, especially aphids and scale which can be hard to see, and diseases.

Rhonda asked members to write clearly when completing the benching cards and

Plant Booking in Form. All plants to be entered need to be written on the form.

Table Top Display:

Entries for a table top display must be booked at least 24 hrs before the show by contacting our Show Marshal, Jan Robinson. Her phone number is on the flyer and show schedule.

Call to Novices and Intermediates

Rhonda urged our Novice and Intermediate members to put plants in the show, and bring them along to our meetings. Even though members may feel their plant is not good enough we want you to be proud of your efforts and your plants. You may even earn points or an award for your plant. So, if your plants are in flower, please bring them along so we can enjoy them.

Selling Plants:

Rhonda went over the process for selling plants, such as having two tags in the pot. The price and the member's name on a white or yellow 'Zip Lock Tag' clipped securely to the orchid or a hard white tag in the pot. The second tag has the name of the plant written on it. Zip lock tags will be available at the show.

Ensure each plant is well established in the pot or on the mount, and is free of weeds, pests and disease. The plants will be checked before being placed on the table as we have had trouble in the past with poor quality plants. The Society retains the right to reject any plants not suitable for sale.

All plants sold will have the 15% commission deducted from the price. For those who do not volunteer at the show, the commission taken is 20%.

All unsold plants must be picked up at the close of the show at 2pm on Saturday.

Selling NSW Native Plants:

Under our Growers' License any NSW Australian native plants will need the addition of a 'Plantation Grown' tag, available from the Society or this written on a tag. The name of the plant is to be written on the Harvest Return Form and given to the sales table staff as these plants need also to be checked prior to being placed on the sales table. If it is a hybrid, the parentage needs to be written on the tag. These forms are sent to NPWS so please make sure they are legible.
