Expanding your Universe in a Shrinking World

(or how to get the most out of your greenhouse!)

We've all had the same problems, haven't we? Limited space, limited resources, limited time and wildly expanding orchid collection. So, what do we do??

Do we limit our spending on new orchids? (I **don't** think so!); reduce or stop our dividing up of large and overgrown orchids?

(Nope not going to happen!); Offload those plants you no longer desire (maybe or maybe <u>not</u>); or simply reject that offer of swapping for that rare and exotic orchid you have always longed for? (have you lost your mind!!!). These are hard and difficult decisions to make but maybe there is a simple and easy solution to your problems!

Many of us don't have the yard space to build another shade house, many of us don't have the resources to enlarge our existing greenhouse, and many of us are facing a possible ecological disaster if we continue to allow our plants to intergrow in overcrowded and poorly ventilated spaces of the backyard, veranda, side of the house or on crowded bench tops.

Wire/mesh (walls and roof):

The answer may be staring you right in the face. Look at your walls and roof and realise those sparse and empty features are a treasure-trove and an answer to your prays!

If, you have bench tops covered with wire mesh, hopefully the leftovers can be utilised to mount on either (or preferably both) the walls and roof of your existing shade or green house.

The roof can accommodate utilising hooks for those orchids that love being in a hanging baskets/pots and require good air circulation and ventilation (such as Cattleyas and Stanhopeas).

O-rings (walls and bench tops):

The walls and edge of your current bench tops can potentially accommodate a huge number of O-rings for those smaller pots/plants that get lost in the general display of a single bench top.

These O-rings can allow the repositioning of these orchids to expand (such as Dockrillias with their downward growth habit) without being distorted by overcrowding plants creating unwanted shading and a restriction of sunlight. (cont'd next page)

Extra shelving (below and above existing benchtops):

More shelving can be installed below and above your existing bench tops (if you haven't already). The upper shelf (which probably should be narrower than your existing bench to prevent overhang and overshadowing. This can accommodate those orchids that favour more direct and bright sunlight (such as Dendrobium speciosum and/or kingianum).

The shelving installed below (which can usually be overshadowed by the benches above), should be wider than the above benchtop enabling it to capture as much light as possible. This lower shelf will enable it to accommodate those orchids that prefer a more sheltered and filtered light circumstances (such as Masdevallia)

The floor:

Then, there is the obvious, the floor. Which can be fraught with dangers both physical (tripping) and insectile. If your shade house has a floor of dirt then be aware <u>not</u> to place potted plants directly upon it, as the drainage holes of your potted orchid can provide an entry point for destructive insects such as snails, slugs, beetles and worms into the potting mix.

Once these insects get into your plant medium it is very difficult to rid them.

If you can cover your floor with either a weed mat, gravel, concrete, woodchips etc this will provide a more secure base for your plants from insects if you choose (or have no other option) than to leave them on the floor. Just be aware the floor/ground is a very real battleground and a dangerous place for plants especially when you hope they will be sprouting new growth, new stems or flowering spikes without being attacked by such evil and furious eaters like grasshoppers and similar destroyers of orchids.

Also, if you place upturned terracotta pots upon the ground to enable your orchids to sit upon be aware that an upturned pot provides an ideal dark hiding place for snails and slugs to secret themselves from you, insecticides and other predatory creatures that feed upon them and benefit you. A sprinkle of salt surrounding the pots or drainage hole will effectively block slugs and snails providing a safe environment.

Finally, the physical tripping or stubbing of toes can be an issue if there are many pots sitting either on the ground or upon upturned pots, therefore try to avoid this situation if possible.





CHANGES TO ON-LINE BANKING:

GENERAL MEETING 14th July 2025

OUR WINTER SHOW 2025:

Rhonda gave a review of our Winter show. She thought it was a great success with a great number of plants benched and a good variety. This year 142 plants were benched by 21 growers, where last year we had 97 plants by 14 members. Rhonda congratulated Jan Robinson on winning Grand Champion with her Dendrobium Lawesii Bicolor, and the

other Champions and prize winners. She thanked all those who put plants in the show.

The financial outcome was a profit of \$382.80. The non-payment of Champion prizes worth \$300, the repotting charges, the sale of Bob Moar's books, and the reduction in the payment to \$100 to the Resident's committee, plus the commission from the sale of The Orchid Place's plants, contributed to this positive outcome. Rhonda thanked *The Orchid Place* for their sponsorship of the Grand Champion prize of \$50.

We were very happy with the support show by our members in volunteering their time. The roster was light-on on Saturday but people filled the spots. Rhonda thanked all those who gave their time.

The repotting service was a great success. Thank you to Richie Dimon and David Hicks and others for performing the repotting. The residents really appreciate that we provide this service.

The show judges suggested splitting Class 21 *Best Laeliinae Species* as 15 plants were benched. We will change this for next year.

The committee has decided to change the setting up time to 2:30 to 5pm, instead of starting at 2pm. So, this will be the time for setting up at the Spring show.

We conducted a survey of visitors and this showed that we get most of our visitors from WWS. Facebook, our website and friends generated other attendees with nothing from our Bunnings promotions.

BUNNINGS PROMOTION:

The committee has decided to hold a repotting session at Bunnings Taren Point prior to our Spring show, as these were successful in attracting visitors. We are currently liaising with Bunnings to confirm a date.

BANKSTOWN ORCHID SOCIETY INVITATION:
