Presentation from our November Meeting David Brooks – 'Going Native'





Many of us have, and enjoy growing Native Orchids for various reasons, but how many of us have an in-depth knowledge as to the origins or reasoning behind the breeding of many of the hybrids.

Last meeting, (accompanied by some great PP photos) David Brooks gave us a terrific insight into some of this breeding, especially with a focus on the species Den. bigibbum (pictured) as a parent, to increase flower size, improve shape, and also in many cases, to increase the number of flowers per raceme.

In addition. many of these hybrids will exhibit a habit of flowering again in the same year, a great advantage for exhibiting at meetings or a show!

Thank-you David for your most informative presentation, hopefully many of us will now be thinking more along these lines, and pursuing acquisition of some of these hybrids to add to our collections.

This Month's Featured Article:

'Losing Myself in the Shade House' courtesy - Mark Drury











Like most growers I greatly enjoy my time potting around inside the shade house!

There is always something to do, either inspecting individual orchids for new flower spikes, looking for emerging fresh growth, photographing a new spectacular flower display or simply looking for insect attack/damage, the jobs are sometimes never ending.

There is always something to do inside my little hide-away and I treasure these moments immensely. **But be warned** - these treasured moments inside your shade house may come at a cost!


